### **Our Lady of Compassion church Meeting Room**

As part of our duty of care for the health and safety of all who come to our church, I sent a general message to you all a couple of days ago to alert you that one of our children who was present at the 11.00am Mass last Sunday, has tested positive for Covid. Thankfully she is experiencing only mild symptoms and we hope she recovers fully soon. Because she was also present in the meeting room for coffee after Mass, I asked all those who were also there to check and follow current government guidance about proximity to anyone who tests positive for the virus.

As is the required practice, the Archdiocese was informed about the situation. They have advised that we find a larger venue for the serving of tea and coffee after Mass. There is concern about the size of the room, the numbers gathering at one time and poor ventilation. Until we find a new venue, **tea and coffee after the 11.00am Sunday Mass will not be served**. This will come as a disappointment, but as we move towards the winter we will have to become more cautious. The virus remains highly infectious and we know that those who are double jabbed can still acquire and pass on the infection.

To conclude, I want to express my gratitude to you all for carefully observing the safety protocols in our churches of wearing a face covering throughout the Mass and using hand gel as you come in. I also ask that we continue to be mindful of distance, particularly for those who are still finding their way back to church. We can be sure that our efforts are keeping us all safe.

### **Season of Creation: UN Climate Change Conference (COP26)**

The UK will host the 26th UN Climate Change Conference (COP26) in Glasgow from 31 October to 12 November 2021. 'COP' means 'conference of parties'. Leaders from 197 countries, including Pope Francis, who have signed up to the UN's climate change treaty, will travel to Glasgow to take part in the conference. This will be the largest gathering of world leaders ever to take place on British soil. The focus of the conference will be how to keep temperature rises below 1.5C. If the world warms more than this threshold, millions more people in the most vulnerable communities around the globe will suffer from devastating droughts, storms, floods and other impacts of climate change. Governments will be obliged to set out more ambitious goals for ending their contribution to climate change under the Paris Agreement (2015).

## **CTiFAH Food Pantry Update**

Formby Food Pantry, organised by the local charity 'Compassion Acts' in partnership with Churches Together in Formby, Altcar and Hightown, has now been up and running in Formby for two months. With seven volunteers on board we work in pairs on a rota basis every Monday morning in Holy Trinity's Workshop and welcome individuals referred to us by Compassion Acts. The folk we see are defined as 'just about managing', perhaps single parents or people recently made redundant, perhaps coping with escalating debts. Some are indeed working full-time, but are in inadequately paid jobs. There can be all sorts of reasons for financial difficulty and Compassion Acts has a range of expert counselling and help on offer, whether to tackle debt, ease access to government benefits or help with budgeting – the aim being ultimately to set people free from the trap of poverty through a programme which, in a series of steps over an extended period, will help to transform their circumstances.

Membership of the Food Pantry is for one year, as the second step up from the food bank. Members pay £5 per visit in order to purchase £20-worth of groceries. Each week, in a relaxed and informal atmosphere over a cup of coffee, we get to know them and help them compile their shopping list for the week. Any counselling needs we become aware of we refer back to Compassion Acts.

At the moment we do not have an actual food-store here in Formby, so we take the completed shopping lists to the nearest stocked Food Pantry (currently in Southport, but with one soon to open in Birkdale). We collect the goods and deliver them directly to people's homes. In addition to the tinned/boxed foods, toiletries, etc. from the store, we are also able to choose a few perishable items for each client from a selection of fresh goods (bread, fruit and vegetables), kindly donated by supermarkets, so that each person will receive two bulging bags of groceries - always received with enthusiasm!

We feel that the work is going well. We are getting to know some lovely folk and it is a privilege to help restore some hope to desperate situations. It is also sobering to see how easy it can be to fall into poverty in the current climate, so there is no room for complacency or blame.

We began the work fairly gently, approaching a few families, but we are now looking to advertise more widely, so that more people in need can see where help is available. Please spread the word to anyone you think might be interested. We are most grateful for all of the prayer, donations and encouragement from our home churches. Please be assured your help is well used.
