### **Season of Creation: CAFOD'S Harvest Fast Day**

As we enter the last week of the Season of Creation, we are invited to give thanks to God for the gift of creation and the fruits of the earth which sustain us. Many churches and schools do this through Harvest Festivals – bringing the fruits of the earth and the work of human hands and sharing these offerings with those in need.

In the UK, for the last sixty years, the Catholic Church has marked harvest time by observing CAFOD's Harvest Fast Day on the first Friday in October. So, this coming Friday, 1st October, we are invited to give thanks by going without a meal or some form of amusement and giving what we save in this way to CAFOD. CAFOD uses our offerings to help those across the world who don't have access to the fruits of the earth because of extreme poverty, food shortages, conflicts and natural disasters.

**Our Lady's Fellwalkers:** October walks are on Saturday 9th October 2021.

The **A Walk** is 9.8 miles with a total climb of approximately 400 m. The walk is in three distinct parts, bridleways, including some climbing that takes us up to the middle part of the walk over open moorland, returning by bridleways and fields paths passing nearby Casterton and back to Devils Bridge.

The **B Walk** is 7.5 miles with a maximum ascent of 100m. Walking from Devil's Bridge to the small historic village of Whittington with its traditional stone built cottages and St. Michaels Church originating in 1200 AD. We walk back along the banks of the River Lune.

Kirby Lonsdale is a market town on the banks of the River Lune, on the edge of the Yorkshire Dales and Lake District, and has many independent shops, cafes and hostleries for post walk window shopping and refreshment. St Marys 12th century church is a favourite site to visit, where signs in the churchyard corner lead to Ruskins View - a panorama of the Lune Valley.
