Thoughts of Pope Francis:- Love is the supreme rule for following the path of Christ, it makes us aware of our weakness, and merciful and in solidarity with the difficulties and weaknesses of others.

Thought for us:- Last week Gee WALKER received a 'Pride of Britain' award for her work to try and eradicate hate from our society. Gee WALKER'S son , Anthony, was brutally murdered in Huyton sixteen years ago. Anthony was 18 years of age and was killed because he was black. A murder born of hate brought on by petty selfishness and worldly needs and wants. The day after the murder Gee WALKER, who describes herself as a 'Christian', said, "I have to forgive them. OLOC Fellwalkers are out on 13.11.21 for two walks in Cumbria, both are linear and start at Ings in South Lakeland, on the course of the River Gowan and end at Staveley. The A Walk is 9.7 miles with 1500 ft of climb. The first mile or so is along a quiet country road and goes slowly uphill. The walk then carries on over fields to a summit of approximately 1000ft. Then down hill overlooking Kentmere Tarn and Hall Woods. After crossing the River Kent, the walk climbs up to Staveley Head fell before walking back down and into Staveley, the last mile or so is on a quiet country road.

The B Walk is 7.7miles long with 1000 ft of climb and shares much of the route with the A Walk, but doesn't get as far as Kentmere. There are climbs before and after lunch, along good paths and roads.

At the time of writing neither walk has been reconnoitred due to the weather, so some of the detail may change but the general outline is the same.

Our destination is known for the independent Hawkshead Brewery, whose beer hall is located in the Mill Yard at Staveley, and there will be an opportunity there for those who wish to partake of post walk refreshment.
