WORD FOR CHILDREN

The reading of the Word of God at Mass is a most important part of the celebration. At Sunday Mass, it takes on an even more special importance, since it is the Lord's Day. God's Word is to be heard by everyone, adults and children alike. But children need an experience of God's Word suitable for their needs. What has commonly been known as 'Children's Liturgy' has, for many years, shared and explained the Word for children.

Here, in our parish, we are beginning a new initiative called 'Word for Children'. It follows the well known structure that we are familiar with. It's newness lies in its approach, structure and resources. Because it meets only for a short time, it has the simple purpose of reading and explaining the Gospel of the Mass to the children. This will be done in a variety of ways, but always with the intention that the children understand something of the Gospel itself.

It might be tempting to see these moments as a chance for a quick 'escape' from the celebration of Mass, or even a chance to give our children a 'distraction' from Mass. That is not its purpose. It is a part of the Mass and a celebration in its own right. We are currently reflecting on the best way to celebrate Mass with children in the future. This is something that will take place each Sunday and which has a specific purpose.

The question then arises, what age range is this celebration intended for? The term 'children' is quite broad, but it is clearly intended for the youngest. We are inviting children up to First Communion age to take part, that is, up to about the age of 8. Obviously, this is fluid, but as children grow older they are better able to hear and understand the Word of God in the main assembly.

The life of society and of the Church in particular, has been deeply changed by the need to protect our children at all times, particularly in public places. Safeguarding in the Catholic Church has undergone stringent change, especially recently. Wherever children gather together publicly, especially in church, there are now very specific requirements that must be met for all those who gather with the children. Our catechists, who teach the children, undergo full safeguarding checks. For our parents who bring their children to the meeting room, particular requirements apply.

At first sight, this might appear unduly restrictive and off putting. Why can't a parent just come into the meeting room and take part in the celebration? What if my child will not go with other children into the celebration, surely I can just take my child in? Hopefully, the following explanation will help.

The celebration is intended to gather children together with the catechists in a safe environment, to listen to the Word of God and have it explained to them. It is usually no more than 20 minutes long and so has to be focussed. It has a similar dynamic to a classroom. Previously, some children have gone in alone and others with their parents. For the first few visits to 'Word for Children' it is perfectly alright for a parent to accompany their child in order to help them to acclimatise to the room and to the other children. But a clearance becomes necessary if the visits become more permanent. This will have to be guided by the catechists who are aware of the requirements.

So moving forward. The celebration of 'Word for Children' will take place at the 11.00am Sunday Mass from next Sunday, the First Sunday of Advent, 28th November. All children, up to about the age of 8, are welcome to take part. At the beginning of Mass, a Gospel book will be entrusted to the children at the Altar, to be taken in procession to the Meeting Room. The children will return to their places at the end of the Bidding Prayers.

I want to say a special word of thanks to those who gather the children to celebrate the Word with them and explain it to them. They have much experience, and they will be very happy to speak with you and answer any questions or concerns you may have. If anyone would like to take part in sharing the Word with our children, then please approach Fr. John.

Thank you for your understanding and co operation, and hopefully our children, in hearing the Word, will grow in an awareness of the immense love of God for each one of them.
